PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Women in the Republican party are buzzing with energy around key events, policy pushes, and grassroots mobilization. One of the highest stakes drive is for **Voter ID legislation** with calls for signatures to qualify it for the 2026 ballot and **opposing Prop 50** in the November 4 special election, seen as a threat to secure voting.

No on 50 is seen as a Democratic power grab that undermines California's nonpartisan redistricting model. It is now the 10th most expensive ballot measure in California history, with the Yes campaign raising over 61 million (including \$10 million from George Soros) and the No side over \$40 million (led by Republican donor Charles Munger Jr.).

October is here, and with ballots mailing out on October 7, now is the time to act decisively against Proposition 50 – a dangerous Democratic scheme that hands redistricting power back to Sacramento politicians, undermining the independent Citizens Redistricting Commission we fought so hard to establish. This isn't just about maps; it's about protecting your voice, ensuring competitive districts and keeping California the Golden State not the rigged state.

Let's mobilize now!

HOW TO "VOTE SAFE" in San Diego County

To avoid excessive handing and processing, delay in counting, technological intrusion and lack of chain of custody, follow the instructions below to vote in person (no envelope):

- When you receive your vote by mail ballot (VBM), open it to be sure there are no errors. Treat it with care and store it where it will remain safe and undamaged.
 - Do NOT mix your materials with those of other family members. If emergency requires you to vote with the envelope, the one YOU were sent needs to be the one YOU sign.
- Take your VBM to the polls on or as close to Election Day as possible to submit without the envelope. San Diego refers to this as a "carry-in" ballot. You may fill it out at home or use a booth in the polls to mark it after check-in.
 - Mark cleanly and carefully—no cross-outs, erasures, smudges, stains, wet spots. Black or blue ink are
 equally fine.
 - Fully fill in the "bubbles"—no X or √ or circles. No writing or stray marks.
- Inform poll workers you wish to vote in person.
- 4. Provide your name and address as required by law by filling out the check-in form.
- 5. Take form to clerk at electronic poll book.
- Inform the clerk you will use your VBM ballot.
- 7. Sign the poll pad when requested.
- Put ballot in secrecy sleeve and allow clerk to check sequence number at the top.
- 9. Take your marked ballot in the secrecy sleeve to the ballot box and watch the clerk submit it.
- When you get home, shred the return envelope once you have voted.

NOTE:

- Voting early (before polls open) at the ROV is NOT an in-person vote, but simply an in-person VBM vote. You
 do not avoid the VBM processing when you vote that way.
- If poll workers attempt to dissuade you from voting in person, or suggest you are not registered or have already
 voted, the magic words are: 1) "Please summon your supervisor." 2) "Please call your Poll Worker HOTLINE."
 Always be polite and patient but stand up for your rights!!
- Provisional ballot and Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) should be LAST resort.
- If a last-minute emergency keeps you from the polls, seal your marked ballot in return envelope, sign carefully
 and put in mail or allow a trusted friend/relative to drop it off for you at the polls or drop box. If submitted or
 postmarked by Election Day, it will count.
